





FOREWORD

"Ghent, a sparkling city of culture". This phrase captures the essence of a place calling to be revealed. At the foot of the three famous towers lies a city with an extremely rich history. A city embedded in the Middle Ages when Ghent was, next to Paris, the second largest town north of the Alps.

You will hardly ever find such a diversity of architectural styles and treasures of which some are protected as national heritage by UNESCO. Strolling through Ghent often coincides with an adventurous travel through history.

Regardless of the number of stars, they all have one thing in common: not the hotel but the visitor is the star. The people of Ghent are known to guarantee a warm and pleasant welcome. 

1. St Bavo's Cathedral

A beautiful cathedral combining different architectural styles: the Romanesque (the crypt), the high Gothic and the late Gothic. The wide range of paintings includes, among others, "The Mystic Lamb". This world famous altarpiece by Jan van Eyck dates from 1432 and is considered to be the high point in 15th century Flemish art. The cathedral also owns a painting by Rubens: "The Conversion of St Bavo" (1623).

Furthermore, there is a splendid pulpit entirely finished in oak and marble (L. Delvaux, 1741). The organ, in a playful baroque style (1653), is the largest to be found anywhere in the Benelux. There are several beautiful tomb monuments to be seen. The crypt contains 15th and 16th century frescos and a rich collection of church paranhernalia

2. The Castle of the Counts

This medieval fortress was built in 1180 by Philip of Alsace, Count of Flanders. Originally the castle had a military role to play, which was given up in the 14th century. Since then the castle has been used for a variety of purposes; mint, court, jail and cotton mill. The castle contains a crypt and a dungeon, It houses a court museum and an exhibition of historical weapons and armour.

3. The Graslei and the Korenlei

The numerous waterways passing through the inner city all flow towards the former port at the Graslei. The elegant façades of the Graslei and the Korenlei represent different architectural styles. Together they constitute a unique site Ghent can rightly be proud of. Each facade reflects a period of history reminding the visitor of the spirit of enterprise and the busy commercial activities of the old guilds.

4. The Three Towers as seen from St Michael's Bridge

St Michael's bridge is the most impressive bridge in Ghent. From here, one can enjoy a beautiful view of the famous Ghent towers: St Nicholas' Church 4, the Belfry 5 and St Bavo's Cathedral 1. On the left one can admire the exquisite façades of the Graslei 6 and the Korenlei 7 as well as their reflection in the water of the river Lys. On the right side the Gothic St Michael's Church 3 (1.4 - 30.9 ①→⑥ 2.00 - 5.00 pm) and the former Dominican monastery "Het Pand" (see page 8) are located.

St Peter's Abbey is one of the finest monuments in Ghent. The beautiful garden with ruins and vineyard is a green oasis in the busy city. The present buildings date from the 17th and 18th century. The impressive refectory goes back to the Middle Ages. To visit the abbey, you join the digital monk Alison who takes you along the old buildings. He talks to you from a "movieguide", a world premiere! This way, you learn the history of the abbey in a playful manner, without it ever becoming dull. Kunsthal Sint-Pietersabdij is the exhibition hall of Ghent. There are cultural, historical and art exhibitions all year long. There is a pub serving meals, a summer terrace and an exposhop.

The museum evolves constantly and earned its reputation by organizing outstanding and revealing exhibitions.

The collection of the Museum of Fine Arts contains paintings and sculptures as well as drawings and graphics from the Middle Ages till the first half of the 20th century. The museum will be closed for renovations until 2006. To maintain and to reinforce the relations with the public during this period, thematic exhibitions will take place from April 2004 on at the nearby Leopold barracks. A part of the collection is shown in other museums and in the crypt of St Bavo's Cathedral ("The bearing of the Cross" by Hieronymus Bosch).

During temporary exhibitions other cultures are evoked as well. The Alijn House also boasts a beautiful inner courtyard, an ancient pub and a puppet theatre.

Other places of interest







The most prestigious municipal buildings in Ghent are the **Belfry** with the **Cloth Hall** and the **City Hall**.

From the tower of the **Belfry ⑤** one has a splendid view of the city. The Belfry (14th century) with its carillon and bell museum is open from 10.00 till 12.30 am and from 2.00 till 5.30 pm (15.3 \rightarrow 15.11). Ticket: 3,00 EUR (+15 pers. 1,75 EUR, 7/ -12 years 0,90 EUR, -7 free). Free guided tour of 45 min. (1.5 \rightarrow 30.9 + Easter) at 2.10, 3.10 and 4.10 pm. The adjacent **Lakenhalle** (Cloth Hall) was built in the 15th century and completed in 1903. The ground floor now houses the Tourist Office, the first floor gives access to the Belfry and the second floor houses the fencing guild of St Michael

The **Stadhuis** (City Hall), built partly in flamboyant Gothic style (Hoogpoort) and partly in Renaissance style (Botermarkt), is a witness of the architectural development in Ghent during the 16th century. Each of the magnificent halls has its own identity. Guided visit included during the tourist walk (see page 10).

Jacob van Artevelde (ca.1290-1345), Bailiff of Flanders and Captain of Ghent.

The **Patershol** (a), a quarter close to the Castle of the Counts, is characterized by its well conserved medieval structure as appears from the street pattern and the small scale building development. Next to an impressive number of remarkable façades, there are several valuable classified buildings.

One of them is the former **Caermersklooster ③** (friary of the Carmelites), entirely restored, which now houses the Provincial art and culture centre (②→⑦ 10.00 am - 5.00 pm during exhibitions - Vrouwebroersstraat 6 - tel. 09 269 29 10 - www.caermersklooster.be).

The **Groot Vieeshuis** (Great Butchers' Hall), with its fine 15th century wooden truss, houses the Promotion Centre for regional products from East Flanders (free entrance ②→⑦ 10.00 am - 6.00 pm - Groentenmarkt 7 - ₺ - Info: tel. 09 223 23 24 - www.grootvleeshuis.be).

The renovated **Hof van Rijhove** (20) illustrates the evolution of 7 centuries of living standards in a patrician mansion (visit for groups on request - tel. 09 266 57 90 - Onderstraat 22)

The **Rabot** , a fine example of military architecture, was built in 1491 as part of the city defences and also served as a floodgate on the Lieve canal (Bachtenwalle). The visitor should not forget to stop at one of the **Beguinages** : the former St Elisabeth beguinage (Rabotstraat), the Ter Hoyen beguinage (Lange Violettestraat) and the New beguinage in Sint-Amandsberg, which constitute islands of peace and quiet in the busy heart of the city. The **Justitiepaleis** (Hall of Justice) was built between 1836 and 1846 in a neoclassical style influenced by the

Italian Renaissance. It is a well-balanced building in spite of its monumental facades (Koophandelsplein).

The former Dominican friary **Het Pand ?** is also an impressive building. It belongs to the Ghent University and is mainly used as a cultural and congress centre. It houses the rich ethnographical and archeological collections of the university, a remarkable collection of stained-glass fragments and a permanent exhibition of full-size photographs of paintings by Hieronymus Bosch (Onderbergen 1 - tel. 09 264 83 05 - www.admin.rug.ac.be/Pand). The **Aula 3** of the University of Ghent was built in neo-

The **Aula** of the University of Ghent was built in neoclassical style by Louis Roelandt (1786 - 1864), architect of the city of Ghent. It was finished in 1826. Free and decorative interpretation of classical style, inspired by the architecture of ancient temples. Remarkable are the monumental front with huge colonnade and triangular pediment, the peristyle modelled on the ancient thermae, the stately stairway in black marble, and the amphitheatre with a dome supported by 18 Corinthian columns (Voldersstraat 9).

The **Boekentoren** (Book tower), is a part of the University library, designed by professor Henry Van de Velde and completed in 1940. It contains over 2 million books, manuscripts, maps and plans on its 26 floors (Rozier).

The picturesque river Lys

The name Ghent is derived from the celtic word "Ganda" which means confluence. Indeed it is in Ghent that the Lys is carried along to the sea by the Scheldt river. Having the Lys as a faithful guide, we now discover some less known aspects of the city.

Since the 60s the river has lost its economical transport function. It is now more than ever suited for pleasure boating. On the way to Afsnee and Drongen, you will admire its green and graceful banks.

Afsnee, a tiny village at the outskirts of Ghent, is a pearl. Taking the ferry to the other side of the river is quite an experience! You simply cannot take a more authentic ferry. And precisely for this aspect, a lot of artists came here to get inspired. The enjoyable village square with its unique Romanesque church is one of the most remarkable landscapes.

About a kilometer north of Afsnee, the river divides itself in two parts. A third abandoned river arm, the "Oude Leie" constitutes the boundary between Afsnee and Drongen.

Drongen, a district of Ghent tucked away a bit along the Lys, is a haven of peace. The nature reserve "Bourgoyen-Ossemeersen" acts as a buffer against the sparkling city of Ghent. This area consists of hayfields and pastures, watery grasslands and meadows, of which 44 hectares are recognized as a nature reserve. In addition there are many farms and manors. You become aware of the rich history of the region in the town centre. There you will find an ancient abbey which Lieven Bauwens once used as a cotton mill. Now the abbey belongs to the Jesuits, who also built the parish church.

Sint-Martens-Latem and Deurle are considered to be the most picturesque artists villages of Flanders. But they also have much to offer architecturally. Latem boasts a magnificent St Martin's church as well as a historical "Tempelhof" and the charming streets of Deurle seem to have been cut out of a picture postcard. Furthermore, this little piece of Flanders-on-the-Lys can even satisfy the most demanding gourmets.

Discovering Ghent on foot




The red line on the map on the right is a walking tour of ± 2 hours.

Starting from the **Belfry 5** a watchtower from the 14th century with its "Secret", the Bell museum, the carillon and the gilt copper dragon, the Mammelokker (1741, an ancient prison) and the Cloth Hall (15th cent.) - carriage tour possible -, cross St Baafs square: on your left you see the Groot Huis theatre (end 19th cent.) and on your right the monument to Jan Frans Willems (1793-1846, founder of the Flemish cultural movement). Before you stands St Bavo's Cathedral 1 (14th-16th century): triptych The Holy Lamb (Ghent Altarpiece) by Van Eyck, a painting by Rubens, the crypt (14th-15th cent.), several chapels and outside, the Chapel of the Holy Sepulchre. Follow Limburgstraat to the Van Eyck monument (1913), the Castle of Gerald the Devil (1245 - one of the oldest buildings in Ghent) and the statue of Lieven Bauwens (1769-1822 - founder of the mechanized textile industry). Go to the left via Reep, along the **Great Seminary** (1914) and the National Bank (1905) to the Bishop's Palace (1843), Bisdomplein. Continue through Hoofdkerkstraat and Kapittelstraat along the cathedral and turn right into Biezekapelstraat (Achtersikkel - 14th cent.) towards the crossing at Nederpolder. On your right you see the Kleine Sikkel (13th cent.) and on your left the Grote Sikkel (14th cent. - Academy of music). Proceed through Hoogpoort to the hotel Cour St Georges (15th cent.) and across the street to City Hall 4 (15th-17th cent. Gothic and Renaissance)

Take the first small street on your right (Schepenhuisstraat) towards Onderstraat and turn left. At nr. 22 you find Hof van Rijhove and its inner courtyard in the Werregarenstraat. Go on to Hoogpoort, turn right and go to Groentenmarkt, with the Galgenhuisje (1783), the Great Butchers' Hall (15th cent.), the small Offal Sheds and the Graanspijker (13th cent.), now converted into 4 inns. You are now at the Graslei (3), the first port of Ghent - guided boat tour possible - with its magnificent façades such as at nr. 8 the Angel, at nr. 9 the first Corn Measurers' House, at nr. 10 the Staple House, at nr. 11 the small Toll house, at nr. 12 the House of the Corn Measurers and at nr. 14 the Guild Hall of the Free Boatmen.

Go around the former neo-gothic Post Office building to the Korenmarkt, its Romanesque Borluutsteen and St Nicholas' Church 4 (13th-15th cent. Scheldt Gothic). Across the church entrance in Cataloniëstraat you see the renovated 16th century Masons' Guild Hall. Go back and turn left into Veldstraat, one of the main shopping streets. At nr. 45 you find a memorial plaque commemorating the "Peace of Ghent", signed in 1814 between Great Britain and the United States of America. Close by are two remarkable buildings: the Hotel d'Hane-Steenhuyse, on the left, built in Louis XV style (1768) and facing it, the Hotel **Arnold Vander Haeghen 2** (1746) with its museum dedicated to Maurice Maeterlinck, who won the Nobel Prize for literature in 1911, and the graphic artist Victor Stuyvaert. At the end of Veldstraat, at Koophandelsplein, is the Hall of Justice 34 built between 1836 and 1846 in neo-classical style and the monument to Hippolyte Metdepenningen



(1799-1881 - famous lawyer and freemason).

Go left of the building into the Schouwburgstraat. Here is the **Opera House** inaugurated in 1840, with its fine auditorium in Louis Philippe style and its elegant salons. Further away is the **Kouter**, a square with its bandstand, the beautiful rococo **Hotel Falligan** (1755) and facing it, the **Handelsbeurs** (the Exchange built in 1739) with its concert halls. Cross the square to the Vogelmarkt and go left through Koestraat and Kalandestraat until you arrive at Voldersstraat. Go left and see the former **Jesuit monastery** (1642) and the monumental **University Assembly Hall** built in 1826.

Cross Veldstraat into Hoornstraat and turn right to Predikherenlei from where you have a fine view on the rear of the **Pand of** first built in the 13th century and on the back of **St Michael's Church of** (15th-16th cent. Gothic). Climb the stairs to **St Michael's bridge**, from where you have a unique view on the 3 towers and the old port of Ghent. Go downstairs to the **Korenlei of** which displays several fine façades, such as the **Lintworm** (nr. 24), the **Swan** (nr. 9) and the **House of the Unfree Boatmen** (nr. 7) - quided boat tour possible.

Proceed to Jan Breydelstraat, where you cannot miss the impressive Hotel De Coninck (1755), now housing the **Design museum** , which shows classical salons of the 18th century and, in the new wing, a rich collection of modern design.

From the small park opposite, one has a nice view of the Great Butchers' Hall, at the confluence of the Lieve canal and the Lys river. Further on you reach Burgstraat. From the bridge on your right you can see the only wooden façade left in Ghent (16th cent.).

On the other side rises the **Castle of the Counts** ②, a 12th century fortress housing a historical Court museum with impressive coercion and torture instruments and a collection of weapons and armour.

At the **Sint-Veerleplein** there are some beautiful houses from the 17th and 18th century and, in the corner, the monumental gate of the ancient Fish Market (1689) with allegories of the Lys and Scheldt rivers.

Go left to the Kraanlei and notice at nr. 17 the Manneken Pis of Ghent and at nr. 65 Alijn House (2) (14th-16th cent.) with its beautiful inner courtyard and the varied collection on the cycle of life, popular religion, work and leisure activities. At nrs. 79 and 81 are two striking façades: the Flute Player and the Seven Works of Mercy (1669). Cross the bridge and go right to see Mad Meg, a huge 15th century cannon. From there proceed to Vrijdagmarkt, one of the oldest squares of Ghent. It is dominated by the "Sage of Ghent". Some remarkable buildings border the square, such as the Toreken, the 15th century Tanners' Guild Hall (nr. 37), the Cloth Measurers House (nr. 25) and Ons Huis (nr. 9 - 1902).

The nearby situated **St James' Church** , partly in Romanesque, partly in Gothic style, houses numerous art treasures. Via Belfortstraat you go back to the City Hall and the Belfry .
